BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

SJM1 requests that the university of New Mexico health sciences center reconvene the J. Paul Taylor early childhood task force through 2016 and assist the task force to meet at least quarterly and to develop a legislative report. The task force is to report its latest recommendations to the legislative health and human services committee and the legislative finance committee by December 1, 2016.

Copies of the memorial are to be transmitted to the governor, the chair of the legislative health and human services committee, the chair of the legislative finance committee, the secretary of children, youth and families, the secretary of health, the secretary of human services, and the chancellor for health sciences of the university of New Mexico.
